with giving things up as a way to remember Christ's suffering.

While I did give up chocolate (yes, really I did), I honestly found *Lent* this year to be more about realizing God's presence in every aspect of my life. Carrying this stone in my pocket for weeks has been awesome! I know that sounds silly—but it has! Every time I put my hand in my pocket I am reminded that I need to trust God with my burdens and that I am only responsible for what is mine. But, more importantly, it has been a constant reminder that God is with me always. God doesn't ever leave me alone to carry these burdens and He is never the one who contributes to my burden (My yoke is easy; my burden is light..).

Laying the stones at the foot of the cross was a beautiful act of worship today. It occurred to me that if everyone of us who laid our burdens at the foot of the cross were really transformed—really trusted Jesus with all of our cares—our world will be a different place. The truth is that if even one of us is transformed, God will be glorified. Many of our youth are involved in spring sports, concerts, and the 9 o'clock club. I encourage you to attend events when you can to support our youth.




The Annie Armstrong Easter Offering
