Dear friends,

As I reflect on the 17th Annual Remembrance of Martin Luther King, Jr. held in our sanctuary, I am struck by the timelessness of the big ideas and themes. It leads me to think about a problem that shows up in the very beginning of creation. It's like a bad mother-in-law, who

shows up early and stays late.

In Genesis 1 and 2 we have a description of the creation of our world and man. Starting with Genesis chapter 4 there is the sudden introduction of lying, murder, and a host of other sins that continue to plague man today. What happened in Genesis chapter 3? What happened there that still haunts us today? It is sin. Sin is the desire to be god-like. It is all about my ideas, my will, and my ways being the center and goal of my life. This sets the stage to put me at odds with others.

One of the ways this shows up is our relentless drive to divide, label, and separate people. This kind of thinking leads to..."If you do not look like, think like, and act like my group, you are bad, wrong, evil, and must be managed, controlled, or destroyed."

It is this very sin that causes one race to own and enslave another. Racism goes beyond black and white. Like cancer, it can metastasize into many forms. At the base of it all, it denies the dignity that God has conferred upon us all, when we are "created in the image of God" (Gen. 1:27). It denies the dignity God has conferred upon us all with the soaring words of Paul in Gal. 3:28. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

We can all find things to differ and disagree about. Better still, let's find what unites and binds us together. As we kneel together to pray, walk together in service, grow together spiritually, share God's love together, may an unbreakable and unshakeable unity in Christ be formed. This truth will be crystal clear when we are in heaven. May it be a reality that we strive and pray for here on earth.
