Dear friends,



Jacob was in the biggest struggle of his life. What seemed to work for him his whole life, manipulating and maneuvering, was not working. It was not only not working, it was failing at magnificent proportions. The Bible says he was alone to face the wrath of his brother who had not only vowed to kill him, but was bringing along 400 troops to do it. Even Jacob could not run away from or manipulate his way out of 401 to 1 odds.

One Page Summary Facility Use Group Recommendation to the Church:

1. RECOMMEND A MASTER PLAN BE USED TO GUIDE WBC IN EFFECTIVE AND FOCUSSED SPACE USE

Main Building (Sanctuary-Fellowship Hall-Classroom Wing)

- **♦** Focus
 - ♦ Worship Evangelism Discipleship
- ♦ Generalized guide of space use
 - ♦ Sanctuary Fellowship Hall Classrooms
 - ♦ Church offices Library Meeting areas larger working areas (quilting, etc.)

Youth Building

- ♦ Focus
 - ♦ Fellowship Evangelism Mission
- Generalized guide of space use
 - ♦ Bathroom shower facilities Storage (Old Nursery Room) Large meeting room
 - ♦ Youth

The Rock

- Focus
 - ♦ Fellowship Ministry
- ♦ Generalized guide of space use
 - ♦ Junior Youth Future Youth Minister Office
 - Quiet space or Prayer Room type area Storage (Attic)
 - ♦ College (upstairs with rear entrance access) Senior Groups (1st floor rooms usage)
 - ♦ Front two rooms Classrooms, vacation Bible School, Meeting rooms
 - ♦ Pantry Area Room Operation Christmas Child long term
 - ♦ Ist Floor Room in rear Cancer Baskets long term
 - ♦ Exterior Basketball goals, paved parking. Fenced play ground

2. REGARDING CAPITAL PLANNING, RECOMMEND IMMEDIATE AND SHORT-TERM PROJECTS:

- a. Construction of improved bathroom and shower facilities in the youth Building.
- b. Initiation of necessary improvements to maximize use of The Rock. Such improvements would include:
 - i. Cosmetic paint and cleaning throughout the interior and maintenance/cleanup of the immediate grounds
 - ii. Electrical cleanup, safety review and updating as may be necessary,
 - iii. Outfitting the old kitchen area to again be able to serve as basic operating kitchen area
 - iv. Cleaning out of the 3rd floor attic area to receive current storage relocated out of the Main Buildings,
 - v. Removal of existing floor coverings, re-finishing wood floors and install new floor coverings,
 - vi. Exterior re-defined paved parking, green space for play, and fencing as applicable to intended uses.

3. RATHER THAN "RE-INVENTING THE WHEEL" IN NEW OUTREACH, RECOMMEND WBC SUPPORT OF:

- a. Food Bank,
- b. Clothing collection,
- c. Serving of meals in the community,
- d. Tutoring programs

4. REGARDING SEVERAL ISSUES RAISED, THE FOLLOWING IS RECOMMENDED:

- a. Address expanding maintenance plans for care of the Rock and the Youth Building,
- b. Address security measures and implement plans to address the Rock and the Youth Building,
- c. Remain open to future gymnasium opportunities for the Church.

CONCLUSION: This is our recommendation to the Church Fellowship at this time in March 2012 based on our current facilities, current projected needs, membership, and Church activity. Changes to any or all of these parameters will dictate an ongoing assessment of this Master Plan throughout the Church years; it is His direction and needs that we must remember need to guide us in the use of these facilities.
