Dear friends,

A survey by the Pew Research Center Forum indicates that there has been has been an increase in Americans who are unaffiliated with a particular religious denomination. In the last 5 years, this number has increased from 16 to 20%. A careful look at the study indicates that it is more a statement about the

institutional church, not about spirituality.

Part of this is an image problem with the modern church and part of it is a problem of practicing our faith. People are suspicious of institutions of all kinds. How do we get past that?

Let me suggest something revolutionary. It literally will turn the world upside down (Acts 17:6). Jesus defined His mission as "to serve, not to be served" (Mark 10:45). Serving others with the love of Christ and asking nothing in return is truly revolutionary. Our world always expects an angle, a catch, if given a gift.

Servant evangelism is a "conspiracy of kindness" that finds practical ways to serve others and show Christ's love without receiving anything in return. What does this look like in practice?

It can look like a free car wash by members of Wise Baptist wearing t-shirts identifying who we are. We do not accept donations (even if they insist), but do share a connection card that says who we are, and contact information for our church. When people ask why we are doing it, the door is wide open! We can say we just want to give something back or serve our community or show Jesus' love in a practical way. Other opportunities may come in those sound-byte conversations...opportunities to pray or talk more about God.

The only limit to the type of project is our prayerful imagination. Other ideas include: free stamps with coffee/donuts on tax day (April 15) in front of Post Office, umbrella escorts in shopping center parking lots on rainy days, free light-bulb giveaways door-to-door, free smoke alarm battery giveaways door-to-door, pay for person behind you in drive-thru line (leave connection card with cashier), free leaf-raking/mowing/edging, free gutter cleaning, etc.

Imagine if we blanketed our community month after month with small groups of all kinds! If we generously sow the seeds of the gospel, the harvest will come! Be ready to jump in participate when the next servant evangelism project comes along. Better yet...plan one and get started!


