Dear church family and friends,

Our definition of "greatness" is a standard which measures and guides our lives. Greatness in much of our world is about propping up our image in the eyes of others. To be great is how many people serve and

cater to us. It is about power, popularity, and position **<u>over</u>** others.

It perfectly describes the human tendency (the Bible calls it our sin nature) to inflate our own importance in a way that deflates the importance of others. That is contrary to Jesus' entire message.

Jesus' own disciples struggled with this idea. In Matthew 20:27-28, Jesus said that to be great, one must be a servant and that Jesus came to serve, not to be served. This is a lesson Jesus had to teach over and over to His disciples.

Greatness in the Kingdom of God is not measured by how many people serve us, but by how many people we serve. This is a revolutionary idea. How can we be "great" for God and His Kingdom? **How can Wise Baptist Church fully mobilize to serve Jesus Christ in our community and world?**

Be on the lookout for a special Wednesday night 7-week Bible study I will lead on the subject of serving, called "The Greatness Principle". I challenge you to be part of 100 adults present for that study. In April, there will be a "Great Day of Service" which will be an opportunity for 100 people to serve throughout the town of Wise.
