Dear church family and friends,

Human behavior is sometimes a great mystery. Have you ever wondered why you did or said or thought something? We are sometimes like the iceberg, where most of the iceberg is below the surface. Even though you may not

see the part beneath the surface, it is very much there and does have an influence.

Part of what is beneath the surface is our family tree. In the Bible, family trees (genealogies) were very important. In the very first book in the Bible, Genesis (which means beginning), there are 10 genealogies. They established identity, who could and should marry who, determined inheritances, etc. It helped tell who you were.

It is no accident that the two Gospels with birth stories of Jesus each have a genealogy of Jesus to establish His heritage and Who He was. Our genealogy helps to tell who we are. It helps identify part of the "iceberg underneath the water" in our lives. It is both interesting, instructive, and helps us spiritually to have a better understanding of our family heritage.

On these Wednesday nights: Nov. 28, Dec. 5, and Dec. 12, I will lead us to put together information on each of our own family trees into a form that will be both useful and meaningful. On each of the four Sundays of Advent, I will preach on a related theme: Jesus' family tree and His story's impact on our family tree and our story.

Here is what you will need to bring for our Wednesday night series: information (exact dates of births, deaths, marriages) of people in your family going at least back through your great-grandparents. Where do you start if you do not have a lot of that information? Find the historian in your family. Check family Bibles, census data, family cemeteries, etc. Bring old pictures, letters, etc., as well.

It will be interesting, informative, and spiritually beneficial. I look forward to seeing you.
