

The word comes from the Greek word "polis" which meant a city-state. That referred to the group of people organized and agreed upon to be governed in a certain way. Politics, then, just refers to affairs of the city-state. Politicians are chosen or elected officials to help govern the people.

By the time you read this, a pitched election battle, locally and nationally, will be over. This involved politics of an earthly kingdom for Wise County, the state of Virginia, and the United States.

The Apostle John, when he writes the Book of Revelation, is dealing with the earthly political kingdom of Rome. Surprisingly, the gospel of Jesus Christ is more "political" than we might have imagined. The "Kingdom of God" is a political figure of speech. A kingdom is always about the ruler and those who are ruled. The Kingdom of God includes everything and everyone under the rule of God.

The politics of Rome are brute force. It seems powerful and may get faster "results". The politics of Rome are backed up by the mighty Roman armies. The politics of grace seem much less powerful. God's grand announcement is the birth of a tiny helpless baby in Bethlehem. How can the Kingdom of God survive? Look around you...do you see any sign of the Roman armies today? On the other hand, do you see any sign of the spiritual armies of the people of God spread across nearly every corner of this world?

We overestimate the politics of Rome and underestimate the politics of grace. When we wake up Wednesday (depending upon when the new president is declared), remember that there is a greater kingdom upon which all lesser, earthly kingdoms depend.
