Dear church family and friends,

Something that puzzles me is the power of negativity. It exerts a powerful pull on all of us. Why does bad news, which fills the media, command our attention more than good news? Why does one negative comment seem to get more traction than nine positive comments?

Someone once said that "bad news has already traveled around the world while good news is still getting its boots on". Does it indicate a deep belief inside of us that is confirmed every time something bad happens? It is as if we are saying to ourselves and the world..."this is what life is really about".

The end result can be that it discourages and defeats us. When we look more deeply, it is a point of view that is lacking in hope. I believe it is also unbiblical. We may not even realize we are thinking this way.

The gospel means "good news". It is the good news that Jesus Christ, our Savior and Redeemer", has come. The Bible is a book of hope. It tells the story of God seeking a personal relationship with each of us in order to redeem and reclaim our broken world. We have the grand privilege and purpose to participate in that mission.

Even the book of Revelation is fundamentally about hope. Too often, it is pictured to be about doom and destruction. That is a message of defeat. That misses the larger idea of God's final victory.

Dear ones, whenever the bad news of the world overwhelms and defeats us, let us challenge that bad news with the good news of Jesus Christ and His saving, redeeming power! I leave you with the final verse in the Bible. Rev. 22:21 says "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with God's people. Amen"
