Dear church family and friends,

Difficult people are in every place and walk of life. There is no way to avoid them. It only takes a few difficult people to disrupt our lives. It is more than just the actual faceto-face time we spend with them. Sometimes they get into our heads, come home in our minds, and even

keep us awake at night.

Joy is one of the marks of a follower of Jesus Christ (see Phil. 4:4). Close encounters with difficult people can put a big dent in our joy. The Bible has a wealth of wisdom to help us. The current sermon series is on "Toxic People". Last Sunday the subject was the "Intimidator". The following weeks will cover "The Manipulator", "The Negative Person", "The Passive-Dependent Person", The Gossip", and "The Know-It-All".

The intimidator is sometimes called a bully. Paul encourages young Timothy in II Tim. 1:7 – "God gave us a spirit not of fear, but of power and love and self-control." Timothy felt fear much as we have felt in relation to bullies in our lives.

We need to see and understand what is happening. Sometimes, we have experienced something so often that it seems normal. Bullying stops when it stops working (for the bully). Giving the intimidator what he wants only reinforces the behavior.

Next, think and pray about options. You have more options than running away or caving in fear. Take a stand. Be firm.

You decide when, how, and where to meet the intimidator. Do not expect him to be happy about the terms. We are here on this earth mainly to please God, not to keep everyone around us happy. Love, Pastor Mike

About Operation Christmas Child: For 20 years, Operation Christmas Child has answered the call to share the love of Jesus Christ with hurting children around the world. The Mid-Atlantic region packed **798,280** shoe box gifts and **over 8,000 shoe box gifts came from our area** (Dickenson, Wise, Scott, and Lee counties). Since 1993, more than 103 million gift-filled shoe boxes have been distributed to children in more than 150 countries worldwide. Dedicated volunteers work yearround to promote and pray for Operation Christmas Child.
