

In my continuing article on why churches are losing their dominance in society, we covered With Our Words and Complaining, Entitlement, Short-Sightedness, Self-absorption and Judging. This week, we are talking about Unrealistic Expectations of Our Leaders, People Pleasing and Pew Warming.

Unrealistic Expectations of Our Leaders Our pastors and ministry leaders are expected to do all things within the church and that is just not realistic. The pastors/leaders can't be everything to everyone. Most pastors, whether full-time or part-time, put in more hours in their "work week" than any of us have ever done on our jobs. They are expected to be in the office from 9-5 Monday thru Friday, visit the sick, answer phone calls, visit families in the community, invite people to their homes, take care of the church building, serve on every committee, meet with other pastors in the community, take part in community events, and the list continues. In addition to these administrative duties, they are expected to have a new and exciting Bible study, post articles on social media and have a dynamic sermon on Sunday mornings. All of these things are expected by church members and are in fact, a part of the job, but pastors are people too, with lives outside of the church like we all have. They have families and obligations to not only God, but to others. We should pray continuously for our leaders that God will direct them on the right path, not on the path we would choose them to travel.

People Pleasing Do we do things within our church to make us look good or to try to appease others in our church? Do we attempt to do too much or too little? Do we look to others for the gratification instead of God? When we serve because of God's prompting, He will ignite us and lead us and give us the ability to complete the assignment. If we just take it upon ourselves without God's prompting, we are tempting burn-out and failure. That doesn't mean that when called upon, we should decline, but that we seek God's prompting before accepting.

Pew Warming We all have spiritual gifts. God has told us we have spiritual gifts and we need to learn what those gifts are and use them. If you aren't sure what your gifts are, there are many places that you can go to on the web to determine exactly what your gifts are. Do you like to sing? Are you an organizer? Leader? Teacher? Get involved. God wants you to be active in your church; He wants you to connect with others; He wants you to live your life fully, and serving His kingdom is a large part of that. Don't just come to worship on Sunday and warm your pew, reach out and warm your heart to what God is asking you to do.
