

"Come, O Come, Emmanuel"

As we approach the start of advent, it is important to look into the meaning of popular hymns that we sing during this important time. For the first week of Advent, we are focusing on the prophecy of the birth of Jesus Christ. We will be looking at the background of "O *come, O come, Emmanuel.*"

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," is a hymn that dates back over 1,200 years to around the 8th and 9th centuries. The original text was set in Latin and was called Veni, Veni, Emmanuel. The song was eventually translated in 1861 by a man named John Mason Neale (1818-1866). Jon was a famous architect of the Oxford movement and discovered the Latin hymn in the appendix of an 18th-Century manuscript. The hymn has both a beautiful and haunting melody that sets the tone of the prophecy of the birth of Jesus Christ.

> Veni, Veni, Emmanuel Captivum solve Israel, Qui gemit in exsilio, Privatus Dei Filio. Gaude! Gaude! Emmanuel, Nascetur pro te Israel!

O come, O come, Emmanuel And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel, Shall come to thee, O Israel.
