Dear church family and friends,
 The world population is 7.3 billion. Population for the United States is 319 million. Virginia and Wise County populations stand at 8.3 million and 40,000, respectively.

Also, there are local issues: the economy, prescription drug abuse, poverty, educational disadvantages of many children, foster child care needs, etc. The size of the population and problems can lead us to feel overwhelmed, even paralyzed. What can one person do about it? What can the church do?

The paralysis we feel partly comes from the idea that we must be able to fix or solve the entire problem for it to matter. It is hard to know where to begin.

I love the story about the man who was on the beach, where hundreds of starfish had washed up and were going to die. He picked up a starfish and threw it into the ocean. Someone saw this and remarked to him, "What difference can you make? You won't even save a fraction of them all!" The man replied as he threw another back into the ocean, "It makes a difference to this starfish".

If you can touch one person, it makes a difference! One person. So many children come from homes where their parents are unable or unwilling to provide a healthy home environment. There are many factors: abuse, drugs, etc. These children begin school behind. They are late learning to read. If children cannot read, then their education and future is severely handicapped.

How can you help? Volunteer to read to children at school or for children to read to you. A child who can read, can learn. Children who can learn have a different future. Or, you could take in a foster child or help provide resources.

Too often we just complain about politics. Call your town council members and Board of Supervisors. Thank them for serving. Ask how you can help be a part of the solution. Tell them you are praying for them.

Those are just a few ways we can be "salt and light" (Matt. 5:13-14) to the world. If one person can make a difference, imagine what an entire church can do...with God's help! Make a difference to at least one person this week, volunteer, invite someone to church!

NOVEMBER 16TH-23RD




